What do I write on them? HELP!

Ok, so each card needs four to five things:

- 1. The term written out...obvi.
- 2. Page # for reference.
- 3. The definition of the term. Put this in your own words as best you can. This may include dates, meaning, places, etc.
- 4. The significance of the term. In other words, why does it matter? (Ex. For Wundt, he is significant because he "established the first psychological lab...")
- 5. A sample or example that uses or explains the term and helps you remember it. Could be a mnemonic device of some sort, who knows get creative! (for people you can **skip** this...or get really creative, whatever helps you to remember.

Ok, that should be pretty clear, but here's a model anyway! You don't have to cleave to this model, but this would suffice and may be a good place to start.

Behavioral Perspective (recommend you put on back)

p. 11

Def: TB: objective, observable environmental influences on overt behavior. MY: analysis/observations of peoples reactions to stimuli.

Signif: "shaped the course of psychology," Watson & Skinner's work on learning/acquiring behaviors was highly influential, still around today (modern)

Sa/Ex.: I watched my dog eat different foods I put in his tray and found it interesting how different his reactions were.
